Basic Soft Contact Lens Agreement

Congratulations on the decision to wear contact lenses. Contact lenses can provide many benefits to your life, but proper fitting, care, and use is vital to optimize your experience with your lenses.

The contact lens fitting process requires various steps. A contact lens fitting involves:

- Determining your contact lens prescription and ability to wear contacts
- Determining the best lens options for you as an individual
- Ensuring proper fit and maximum vision
- Teaching you to handle your lenses properly if necessary
- Following you for signs of problems related to lens wear.

Most of these steps are NOT part of a general eye exam, and therefore the fitting and follow-up of someone wearing contact lenses is not included in the fee for a comprehensive eye examination. Because not everyone wears contact lenses, an annual eye exam does not factor in the contact lens evaluation. This fee is yearly, as long as you continue to receive a contact lens prescription.

After or as a part of your eye examination, the following extra tests may be done: evaluation of lens fit, measurement of vision through lenses and over-refraction to determine proper prescription, and instruction on inserting, removing, and caring for your lenses. For new fits and refits there is a 90-day follow-up period included to allow for later evaluation and modification if needed. If you are given a re-prescription but find that the lenses are not working well and need a follow-up, you will be charged for the difference in price between a re-fit and re-rx.

Payment for the professional fees associated with contact lens wear is always required whether you decide to keep your lenses or not. Disposable contact lenses are only purchased after a trial period has been completed and you are satisfied with your lenses. Soft contact lenses can be returned only if in original unopened packaging.

The cost of lenses and fitting may be covered by your vision insurance plan or deducted from your contact lens balance. If you do want these costs submitted, please let us know that you wish us to do so. Once submitted, you are responsible for any balance not covered by your insurance. Contact lenses cannot be submitted to medical insurance unless they are being used for the treatment of an approved medical condition.
